



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## Leadership development and teaching

Our leadership training programs create changemakers by providing necessary 21st century skills to the youth of Bangladesh and instilling values of tolerance, compassion, empathy, and inclusiveness in them.



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#### BUILDING BRIDGES THROUGH LEADERSHIP TRAINING

BYLC's ten-week long signature leadership training program is designed for H.S.C./Alim/A levels and first and second year university students. Our BBLT program uses a competitive selection process to enroll 42 students from the three different educational systems, namely English medium, Bangla medium, and madrassa, in equal numbers. The curriculum for the program draws heavily from leadership courses taught at Harvard University. The intensive training program, coupled with an experiential learning model, challenges students to critically think about leadership and apply their skills to effectuate positive change in society. In the first phase of the program, students conduct experiments, take risks, and question deeply held assumptions in the classroom. In the second phase, students have the opportunity to translate their learning into action by implementing various community service projects.

- Expand participants' leadership capacity by sharpening their critical thinking, problem solving, and communication skills
- Provide participants with concrete experience in teamwork and project management, community service, and active citizenship



#### BUILDING BRIDGES THROUGH LEADERSHIP TRAINING JUNIOR

BYLC's month-long leadership training program is designed for secondary school students in grades 6 to 10. The program, adapted to suit the learning needs of students aged between 12 and 16, focuses on sensitizing a younger audience to the values of leadership, teamwork, community service, and active citizenship.

Taught by BYLC graduates, the program specifically targets students in secondary school to instill positive values during their formative years, so that these lessons of leadership and



#### YOUTH LEADERSHIP SUMMIT

The three-day long Youth Leadership Summit (YLS) focused on the core challenges encountered by youth leaders, and took them on a journey of collective exploration, reflection, and networking. Through a competitive screening process, YLS brought together a diverse group of young delegates from around the world for an inter-generational dialogue with distinguished experts, innovators, and leaders in the public, private, and non-profit sectors.

The summit featured a mix of plenaries and panels on entrepreneurship, global citizenship, education and career, gender and leadership, politics, and innovation.

Team-building activities and reflection sessions gave delegates opportunities to deepen their understanding of effective, meaningful, and inclusive leadership.

- Create a common space for an inter-generational dialogue and knowledge sharing
- Facilitate leadership training for youth and enable them to take ownership of problems and exercise leadership in uncertain times

#### **MASTERCLASS** ON **LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT**

Masterclass for Leadership Development (MLD) is a five-day long executive course designed for mid-level professionals, and focuses on managing authority, adaptive leadership, social innovation, influence, and group dynamics.

MLD prepares aspiring young professionals for advanced level problem-solving both in their organization and personal life. The entire learning process takes them into a journey of self discovery by analyzing past experiences, learning to adopt and apply the tools and techniques of mobilizing a group, and participating in an active team-building process.

#### INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY SYMPOSIUM

BYLC organized the half-day long symposium সমৃদ্ধির পথে, একসাথে, with support from Manusher Jonno Foundation and UK aid, to commemorate International Women's Day 2019. The symposium, held on March 13, 2019, was aligned with the year's UN International Women's Day theme, Balance for Better.




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#### ALUMNI IFTAR AND AWARDS

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
#### EQUALITY THROUGH DIGNITY

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#### TEACHERS' ROUNDTABLES

To facilitate a broader conversation on issues that matter to youth, BYLC organized a Youth Leadership Summit in 2018, where 350 university students and young professionals co-created a youth manifesto outlining youth's priorities for the future. The findings of the manifesto, which focused on the quality of education and development of relevant skills for a changing world, were presented at a roundtable discussion on *Reimagining Education for a Rapidly Changing World* that involved teachers from 20 institutes.
